Addendum 2

Westminster Abbey visit on Monday 30 Jan 2023

Our thanks go to Frieda Boase for arranging a successful visit to Westminster Abbey (or the Collegiate church of St Peter, Westminster). Twenty members came along to enjoy a most informative and friendly tour led by Julie Chandler (an official Blue Badge Guide).

Dating back to Edward the Confessor in 1065, Westminster was built on the site of a Benedictine monastery which dates from 960AD on Thorney island.

In the lady chapel alone there are fifteen Kings and Queens at rest in a magnificent setting. We paid our respects to the tomb of the Unknown Warrior and learnt how the idea was first conceived by the Reverend David Railton in 1916 while serving as an army Chaplin on the Western Front.

Close to the tomb of the Unknown Warrior we were able to view but not take photographs of the Coronation Chair which dates back to 1308 (otherwise known as King Edwards Chair) which is presently undergoing restoration ready for the crowing of King Charles III in May this year.

It was a most enjoyable afternoon and a visit is highly recommended.

Behind the Scenes – Strictly Come Dancing on Monday 6 March 2023

Frieda has organised another successful trip for 16 members of the Shell Travel Club to 'Behind the Scenes - Strictly Come Dancing'.

Carole Williams our host for the afternoon was a brilliant raconteur with a great sense of humour. She told us how the DSI Studio was founded by Geoffrey Hearn and Peggy Spencer in 1982 and since then, its reputation has grown world-wide.

Strictly Come Dancing was first shown on television in May 2004 with Tess Daly and Bruce Forsyth and its popularity has grown ever since. Saturday evening entertainment brought the ballroom to our screens with added celebrities bringing glamour and showbiz fun.

Amazingly only 4% of the studio's work is devoted to Strictly, with other costumes and dance shoes being created for individuals clients, theatre, Dancing on Ice and Dancing with the Stars spread over fifty countries.

The base of all women's designs is a leotard which is colour matched to the finished design. The fabrics come from all over the world but the beading is generally made in the U.K. The costumes are beautiful creations using the skills of the in-house designer Vicky Gill and the team.
